Every learner has their individual learning background and individual ideas of what they want to achieve in class. As teachers we are therefore continuously confronted with heterogeneous groups. The webinar will explore how learner autonomy and internal differentiation can help us to take different backgrounds into account and how to encourage students to take control over their learning process. In the first part of the webinar, we will discuss what autonomous learning means. In the second part, we look at heterogeneity and focus on methods to introduce internal differentiation in class.
